If, for example, you dig a hole, plop in a \$185 sapling the nursery says ought to live a hundred years, and nicely mound up the soil around its trunk...wrong! You'll be lucky if it lives ten years.

If you plant it OK but City Council doesn't foot the bill to "train" its young trees with knowledgeable pruning over the next 15 years, they'll soon enough be paying for storm-tossed branches and downed trees when the next windstorm rips through town.

Shade Tree Commissions advise and support the efforts of the Mayor, Council, and Public Works Department in the non-trivial task of developing both day-to-day and long-range Management Plans for your very own urban forest.
